>Strategic Partnerships - In 2016, CNE began a long-term strategic partnership with the PATH Foundation in Warrenton, VA. Through this partnership, CNE is utilizing its ten years of experience in high quality, targeted and cost effective program design and delivery to help the PATH Foundation develop and manage a nonprofit resource center in its tri-county service region. CNE also has engaged in short-term strategic partnerships with several other community foundations across the state - in Culpeper, Staunton and Fredericksburg - in order to provide communications training for nonprofits participating in annual online giving days in their respective service areas, as well as training to promote effective board governance.

>ConsultCorps - Also in 2016, CNE launched ConsultCorps, a group of experienced nonprofit consultants partnered with CNE to help solve problems and grow the effectiveness of nonprofits. The roster of consultants, which include CNE staff members, have joined with CNE staff to create a community of practice - working collaboratively with CNE and each other when needed to help guide nonprofit organizational development in the region. CNE provides the following support services to ConsultCorps: helps

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nonprofit clients to develop their scope of work, advises on how best to work with a consultant, connects organizations to an experienced consultant, and administers a follow-up evaluation.

keynote speaker was Melody Barnes, chair of the Aspen Institute's Forum for Community Solutions and newly appointed Senior Fellow at UVA's Miller Center. Melody's message focused on what makes a community resilient, stressing the importance of collaboration. She identified key factors that make collaboration successful: engaging all voices; drawing on expertise from the public, private and nonprofit sectors; and ensuring that philanthropists are strategic partners in the work. In addition to her luncheon remarks, Ms. Barnes also led a workshop for nonprofit CEO's and board members the morning prior to the luncheon. This two-hour program featured lecture, group discussion and small group exercises to help participants rethink their approach to collaboration.

Program Achievements:

In 2016, more than 400 community leaders from the business, public, and nonprofit sectors gathered for the event, which was also featured on local television news stations and in local online and print media. This program generated great, community-wide interest in the ideas brought forth and inspired those who participated to think more strategically about how our community can collaborate and partner:

CNE's 2016 Building Block Training Series consisted of: 8 "Lunch and Learn" trainings. Titles included: Strategic Planning: Tools, Techniques, and Tips; The Intentional Photo; The Ideal Appeal Letter Starts with You; Overtime Rules for Nonprofits; Mindful Visioning Workshop; and Elements for a Successful Website Presence. All of these trainings were free for members and open to the public for a very low cost. CNE held 47 workshop trainings. Titles included: Staff/CEO Relationship, Managing Volunteers, Social Media, Building a Marketing Plan, Program and Project Management, Mindful Leadership, Basics of Nonprofit Accounting, and Mastering the Art of Collaboration. These trainings were offered at a discounted rate for members and were open to the public. Over 730 attendees participated in the Lunch and Learns and workshops.

In addition, CNE provides regular opportunities for its members to meet, network, share new ideas, and build partnerships. Our members report that they join and renew with CNE because of the high quality, targeted tools, trainings and resources we develop to help area organizations be more efficient, more effective, make the best use of donor dollars and have the greatest impact.

Through membership, board members, staff and volunteers receive the local, affordable, and customer-focused support they need to build healthy organizations that strengthen our community. Member organizations also gain valuable exposure in the community through member spotlights, which are posted on CNE's homepage and in our weekly newsletter that goes to almost 4,000 subscribers. Members also can submit postings to our online job,

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board and volunteer listings, which are then featured weekly in our newsletter. Finally, members have the opportunity to utilize CNE's resource-rich library and reserve our training center for meetings. Although CNE is a member-driven organization, we do make many of our trainings, resources, and tools available to the broader community, but members receive discounted rates and have priority on registration.

Program Achievements:

By the end of 2016, CNE had nearly 280 members. Our nonprofit members are focused on 16 different issues, including health, education, arts, environment, and social justice, and have operating budgets that range from \$50,000 to over \$10 million. Members of CNE report great value in being part of the CNE network.

In 2015, CNE conducted its biannual Member Survey. We received responses from 219 members. 97% of respondents indicated that CNE had a positive impact on the local nonprofit sector, with 74% choosing "quite a bit" to "significant" impact.
